Summary:

The Church History Department (CHD) has a doctrinal mandate to collect, preserve, and share historically significant records. This is best accomplished when records are captured or recorded following archival and preservation best practices and standards.

Scope:

This document will provide additional guidelines and standards to the principles outlined in the Church History Oral History Guide.

Requirements for Oral History or audio recordings:

Format: .wav (Broadcast Wave or Wave format)

■ Sample Rate: 96 kHz Bit Depth: 24 Bit

Alternative option where storage space or transfer abilities are limited.

Format: .mp3 (MPEG Audio Layer – III format) Sample Rate: 192 kbps (or higher)

- Tascam DR-05X or Tascam DR-05
- Zoom H1N Portable Handy Recorder
- Tascam DR-100MKIII

Requirements for Video History or video recordings:

- Video Format Wrappers:
 a. .mov (MPEG 4 video container file format)

 - i. .m2ts (AVCHD Advanced Video Coding High Definition)
- Video Codecs:

 - b. XAVC S
 - c. AVC (Advanced Video Coding)
- Frame rate: 60 fps (60p)
- Resolution:
 - a. Preferred: 4K
 - b. Alternate: 1080P or 2K
- Audio Format:
 - a. Liner PCM
 - b. AIF
 - c. AAC
 - d. AVCHD audio
