
How to Identify Good Narrators



ORAL HISTORY HOW-TO GUIDES

WHY IS THIS IMPORTANT? Knowing how to identify good narrators is important because the narrator is the subject of the oral history—the person who shares their experiences. Seek narrators whose stories can add information and insights to the history of the Church.

WHAT TO KNOW. Narrators are normally identified as part of an oral history collecting project. When recommending a different narrator, check the Church History Catalog to see if the narrator has participated in any previous oral histories. Where possible, seek narrators of diverse backgrounds and perspectives unless a specific narrator is needed to speak to a particular topic or experience.
