arol Gray, a housewife, mother of seven, and Relief Society president in Sheffield, England, found a vocation in providing international aid as she watched television coverage of the suffering caused by civil war in former Yugoslavia. She began organizing relief supplies, and by November 1992, she and her daughter were distributing supplies to frontline crisis areas in Croatia and Bosnia. Carol would return to the area dozens of times over the next decade.
